

Beulah May Moses, 94, of Amelia, Nebraska died December 23, 2013 at the Community Memorial Health Center in Burwell, Nebraska.

Funeral services will be 10:30 a.m. Saturday, December 28, 2013 at the United Methodist Church in Burwell. Burial will be in Cottonwood Cemetery in Burwell. After graduation she took the teaching test and taught for three years before attending Kearney State Teacher's College for a year. She continued teaching and took summer classes. She taught school for seven years.

Beulah met Owen Moses when his family moved to a nearby ranch. Owen went to the Army and after he returned they were married on October 18, 1945 at her parent's home.

Beulah and Owen ranched in Holt County. In the late 1940's they moved to the present ranch where they had dairy cattle. Owen died February 8, 2005. Beulah continued to live on the ranch until May of 2013 when she moved to Community Memorial Health Center.

Beulah enjoyed gardening, canning, cooking and baking. She was a member of the Homemakers Extension Club. She also, sewed clothes for her children and herself. Beulah attended the Ballagh Church and then the Cedar Creek Bible Church.

Beulah is survived by four children, Daryl Moses of Amelia, Nebraska, Dale Moses of Burwell, Nebraska, Orin and Benjean Moses of Spirit Lake, Idaho and Marilyn and Rollin Nelson of Ord, Nebraska.
