

Sharon Lea Boucher, 79, of Burwell, Nebraska died October 6, 2023 at the Arbor Care Center in Ord, Nebraska, after a courageous battle with breast cancer.

Sharon worked part-time at Burwell Public Schools in the school kitchen. After the children were in school, Sharon worked at the Bank of Burwell, finishing her career as Assistant Vice President. Sharon was then elected as the Garfield County Assessor and later served as the Assessor for Garfield, Greeley and Sherman counties concurrently. She was on the city council and was appointed as the first female mayor of Burwell. Sharon was the consummate homemaker maintaining a large garden, canning vegetables, baking bread and making wine. Nothing was more important to Sharon than her family and she was a great protector of her children and grandchildren.

Sharon is survived by her husband Red Boucher of Burwell, Nebraska. Three children, Aub and Lisa Boucher of Juniata, Nebraska, Deeny and Jeff Nielsen of Nebraska City, Nebraska and Holly Boucher of Lincoln and fiancé Corey Palmer of Ainsworth.
